Trustees and Staff have pleasure in reporting that the charity has had a successful year with much good work being undertaken “behind the scenes” as well as “front of house” organising well attended, informative and interesting events bringing people together from all faiths, cultures and backgrounds. Network Meetings

Our quarterly network meetings have continued to be very popular with topical issues being on the agenda - in 2018-19 we focused on “Routes out of Poverty”; “Health & Wellbeing”, “The Spark Project” and revisited the issue of “Rough Sleeping and Homelessness in Redbridge”. We are grateful to all those who came along to speak and answer questions from the audience and to our supporters who attended in force. We have been holding network meetings in the Central Library but are experimenting with hosting them in faith venues during the coming year.

Women’s Interfaith Group

This group is thriving with many new faces joining us this year. We have just concluded an interesting series of workshops focusing on “Births - Ceremony, Custom and Tradition” from different faith and cultural perspectives. To celebrate 2019 International Women’s Day one of our group kindly opened up her home for a coffee morning. This proved very popular and lively discussion took place about “Inspirational Women”. The warm welcome and wonderful refreshments were very much appreciated by all.

Social Fundraising Events

Our social fundraisers are a wonderful opportunity for our supporters to come together to enjoy each other's company in a social setting. July 2018 saw our first fundraiser Quiz - this proved to be great fun and so is being repeated on 16th July 2019 at 7pm at The Drive Methodist Church - all are welcome. Interfaith Week falls in November each year and RFF marks this by holding an interfaith meal. In 2018 this was an evening dinner at the Ilford Islamic Centre but for 2019 we will be holding a lunch instead 13th November 2019 12.30-2.30 pm at The Old Courthouse in Ilford.

Annual Walk of Peace

Our 2018 Walk started in challenging weather conditions but we were so pleased to see a big crowd of walkers (plus umbrellas!) assembled in Valentines Park at the start of the walk. A commemorative tree was planted by the Mayor of Redbridge and the group then moved to the nearby Holocaust Memorial Garden to hear a short talk given by Rabbi Becker. Walkers then continued visiting in turn the Buddhist Vihara, Vishwa Hindu Parishad Temple, Ilford Islamic Centre (who were celebrating their Ruby Anniversary), and Vine Church culminating at the Guru Nanak Satsang Sabha Gurdwara. Two extra features this year were the participation of Redbridge Music Lounge who performed some peace songs outside Wilko and a pause for a reflection at the Peace Pole opposite Vine Church to remember the victims of violence in our community. Highlights were incorporated into a short film which also featured two of our trustees speaking about the role of RFF in the borough. Work is "still in progress" and we wish to enhance our signposting facility further.




