# Opportunity to participate in story telling workshop about "You, Me, the World and Redbridge"

For the past six years take stock exchange have been delivering projects in boroughs throughout East London. We begin 2020 in Redbridge with a borough wide project, taking place throughout January and February. We're trying to engage as broad and diverse a collection of groups of people to work with as possible, and we're sure it's something everyone would benefit from.

#### What We Do & Why

The idea behind TSX's work is pretty simple. Each project, we try to work with as wide a range of groups as possible - so, schools, community groups, faith groups, businesses, local government and many, many others! We visit these groups and find ways to empower people to talk to each other, and listen to each other, to tell and listen to stories about their experiences living and working in the local area. We then share those stories with the other people and groups we're working with, and vice versa - a bit like a story exchange. The project gives people a chance to be creative and express themselves, but also to hear from other people, understand their experiences a little better, and have reason to feel a greater sense of belonging to the place they live or work.

#### We'd love you to be involved!

How it works: We would visit you twice. The first time to run a storytelling workshop, where participants would learn storytelling skills, share stories of their own, and listen to others. The second time, we would tell some of the stories we've collected from the other groups we've worked with - and tell participants how other people responded to the stories they shared with us in the previous workshop. At the project's culmination, we will invite all of the groups we've worked with, as well as other members of the public, to come together to eat a meal and listen to a retelling of a collection of stories. Groups we work with can take part in one, two or all parts of the project and we can work with groups of up to 30 participants.

## The project is fully funded by Arts Council England and Vision Redbridge and delivered entirely free.

#### **English for Every Day Project**

Redbridge Institute has successfully won a bid to deliver the Integrated Communities English Language Programme (English for Every Day) in London with five other partners. This is a project funded by the Ministry of Housing Communities and Local Government (MHCLG). We are one of six organisations in the UK to have achieved this. The project aims to improve social integration within boroughs and offer ESOL classes to those that are hard to reach.

We are offering free English classes to people who do not have English as their first language. We have successfully built partnerships with various organisations across London boroughs and are keen to continue to reach out to many more. Our existing cohorts have benefitted hugely from the project. This project has helped learners communicate better and they have enjoyed the classes and enrichment activities that they have attended

The project is due to end in March 2020 and we are keen to reach out to as many people as possible.
