The Department for Education has issued an update (1st July 2020) regarding the re-opening of Out of school Settings: This information also includes advice for parents and carers as well as establishments who hire out their facilities to Out of School Settings.

Re-opening of Out of School Settings:

The Department for Education has issued guidance for providers outlining the protective measures that need to be in place to ensure that, from Saturday 4 July, Out of School Settings can minimise the risk to children, staff and parents who attend their settings by reducing the risk of infection and transmission of the virus.

The Department for Education has also published advice to parents and carers on the precautions they should be taking if they are thinking of sending their child to any provision over the summer period.

"Green Shabbat" sparks Jewish climate events

3-4 July marked "Green Shabbat", an initiative of Eco Synagogue and the Board of Deputies of British Jews in which eight Liberal Jewish synagogues partnered to offer a focus on environmental issues. Changes to urgent treatment centres

Urgent care is for anything that needs the same day treatment. The way patients can get treatment for an urgent health problem is changing.

If you have a minor injuries or minor illness, you can get treatment at an urgent treatment centre by calling NHS 111.

Urgent treatment centres can treat most injuries and illnesses that are urgent. This may include sprains and strains, fractures and suspected broken bones, minor head injuries, cuts and wound infections.

To get treatment at an urgent treatment centre, first call NHS 111. They will assess your condition and book you an appointment to see a clinician and you can avoid spending unnecessary time in the waiting room. The treatment centres have been made as safe as possible for patients and staff, and social distancing measures are in place.

The urgent treatment centres are GP-led, with doctors and nurses who will provide your treatment.
