The group met in December in the home of one of our supporters to enjoy a wonderful lunch and a discussion with different women speaking about their respective faith festivals.




Funding

Redbridge Faith Forum has widened my knowledge of other religions, their religious practices, customs, cultures. Blurred differences of faiths. Friendship, fun, enhanced and stimulation of knowledge -(quiz). Raised awareness of issues pertaining to mental health, homelessness, rough sleeping (general societal) problems. For future events? My main concern is how we can help address the rising criminal activities if at all possible. A very difficult problem to begin to solve.

Through Redbridge Faith Forum I am more aware of other people's beliefs and events that are going on. I have established new connections and made new friends.

Redbridge Faith Forum is of relevance to my working life mainly. It has allowed me to network with others, distribute information, generate ideas for action and learn about the Redbridge Faith community and how it relates to my work. It also has personal resonance as I have learnt and engaged with other faiths in a way that I probably wouldn't have done in my outside of work life, but that has enriched it nevertheless. I would love to take part in more of the RFF activities, but as I live outside the area this is not always possible.
